DEPARTMENT 13 SECTION 1 VEGETABLES

A rosette will be awarded to "Best of Show."

1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens. If at all possible, do not mix varieties.
2. Read premium material carefully following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for five specimens, be sure to exhibit that number; do not enter four or six. In any instance, your exhibits will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens is not entered.
3. Check entire list-items may not be in alphabetical order.

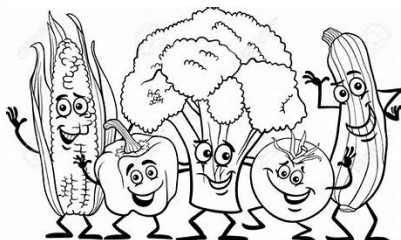
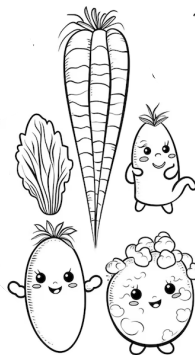
